Either water, weed and prune the garden that you already have, or plant some new things to grow. Take some photographs or make a plant diary of your work.</p>	<p>Reading</p> <p>Write a book review of a traditional tale. What did you think of it? Who would you recommend it to? Which part did you especially like or dislike and why?</p>
<p>Design Technology</p> <p>To link with our cooking and nutrition topic, make a healthy snack or meal for yourself. Think about using the 'eat well' plate to make it balanced and healthy.</p>	<p>Maths</p> <p>Learn to tell the time on an analogue clock using o'clock and half past the hour. Can you write a timetable for your day? Maybe draw a clock for each activity throughout the day.</p>	<p>History</p> <p>Find out about a famous explorer and present your findings. What did they do? Where did they go? What did we learn about the world from them? What do you think their journey was like?</p>	<p>Art</p> <p>Produce a piece of art inspired by our topic.
