



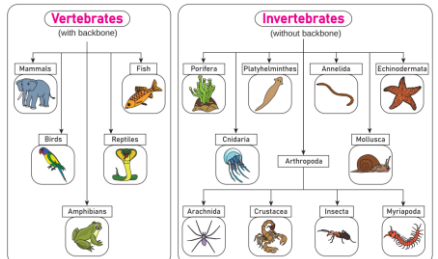



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| Topic | Animals including living things | Term | Spring | Year Group | 3 |
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| Vocabulary | |
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| nutrients | Substances that animals need to stay alive and healthy. |
| vitamins | Vitamins are nutrients that humans need in order to grow, reproduce, and be healthy. |
| hydrate | Hydration is the replacement of body fluids lost through sweating, exhaling, and eliminating waste. On average, the body loses and needs to replace about 2-3 quarts of water daily. |
| muscles | Soft tissues in the body that contract and relax to cause movement. |
| tendons | Cords that join muscles to bones. |
| joints | Areas where two or more bones are joined together. |
| vertebrates | Animals that have a backbone. |
| invertebrates | Animals that do not have a backbone. |
| x-ray | X-rays are special pictures of the inside of your body. An X-ray machine, not a camera, takes these pictures. When the picture comes out, doctors can see broken bones, lung infections, and more. |

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|  <p>enquire</p> | Ask questions about the food and drinks they consume. Research which types of food contain which nutrients. How do these nutrients affect the body? |
|  <p>classify</p> | Classify foods in a range of ways.  |
|  <p>compare</p> | Compare, contrast and classify skeletons of different animals.  |
