



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Vocabulary	
anus	The anus is the opening where your bowel movements come out.
digestion	Your stomach digests food when it softens and breaks down so that it can be absorbed into your body.
digestive system	This is a series of organs that break the food down so it can be absorbed into our bloodstream.
large intestine	The large intestine is also called the colon or large bowel. Water is absorbed here and the remaining waste material is stored as faeces.
mouth	The opening through which food is taken into the body.
nutrients	Nutrients are substances that support our immune systems, maintains healthy bones and teeth and support growth.
oesophagus	The tube leading from the throat to the stomach.
omnivore	An animal that feeds on both plants (herbivore) and the flesh of other animals (carnivore).
rectum	The long straight final portion of the large intestine in the human digestive system.
saliva	The natural liquid in a person's or animal's mouth.
small intestine	Digested food is absorbed in the small intestine.
