<p style="text-align: center;"><i>Maths</i></p> <p>Create some tricky problems which use Algebra. Include problems with more than one step. Can you check your problems work by solving them yourself?</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><i>Computing/History</i></p> <p>Create a PowerPoint about a famous person from British History. Make sure you use accurately spelt and punctuated sentences.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><i>DT</i></p> <p>Create a model of a famous landmark. Study how the building was constructed and draw a diagram to plan your model first. What was special about this building?</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><i>Reading</i></p> <p>Read a poem. Give your response to the poem as a review, summary or report. How could you perform the poem? Plan a performance and video yourself or perform to the class. Otherwise watch some of Michael Rosen's performance poetry on youtube and think about why his performance is effective.</p>
<p style="text-align: center;"><i>Values</i></p> <p>Find out what our Value is for this half term. Create a poster to show why this value is important at home and in school.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><i>Art</i></p> <p>Find a large picture of a face online or in a magazine. Cut the face in half vertically and stick one half onto a piece of paper. Can you draw the other half of the face (where the missing half is) accurately by copying what you can see?</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><i>Science</i></p> <p>What do you notice about the environment at this time of year? Can you complete a survey of the flowers or trees which are in your garden or local area? What different species are there? Are there any insects which live or feed on particular plants? Write a question first. Eg. How many species of local trees blossom in May? or Which plants do bees visit regularly? Present your findings with diagrams and data.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><i>Geography</i></p> <p>Choose a Non- European country or place to find out more about. Locate it in an atlas or on a map. Where is it near to? What continent is it part of? Which oceans surround it? What is the climate like? Present what you have found out as a travel guide.</p>
